Music Therapist

The Music Therapist plays a key role in ensuring that students are supported by effective intervention plans and have access to high quality effective music therapy services. He / she is also responsible in educating others on the music therapy services available to ensure relevant referrals and services are provided. He / she will provide direct clinical care, which encompasses assessment, treatment and management of students in the school, community and home settings.

Key responsibilities:

- a) Assess students referred for music therapy, design and carry out individualised programmes to meet the therapeutic needs of the students.
- b) Identify and prioritize goals for intervention in collaboration with the student/family/caregiver and multidisciplinary team.
- c) Formulate care plans that are outcome based and relevant to students' goals through planning, implementing, evaluating and managing interventions.
- d) Facilitate individual and group interventions employing evidence-based music therapy techniques.
- e) Apply the process of collaborative exploration in the management of caseloads to deliver effective services.
- f) Complete specialist report, case notes and other documentation, following professional guidelines and guidelines required by the organization.
- g) Prioritise and manage a caseload under supervision in accordance to school policy.
- h) Participate in developing protocols and clinical guidelines to improve services.
- i) Maintain and monitor student records related to service utilization in accordance to school and professional requirements.
- j) Maintain inventories of equipment, materials and supplies.
- k) Ensure that the health and safety policy is adhered to and all equipment are properly and safely stored and maintained for safe use.
- l) Engage in and articulate reflection and evaluation in practice, including critically evaluating the impact of contemporary issues related to the profession and sector.
- m) Engage in continual learning through training, sharing, innovation and research.
- n) Remain up to date and compliant with all relevant legislation, organizational procedures, policies and professional codes of conduct in order to uphold standards of best practice.

Requirements:

- a) Degree or Masters in Music Therapy or its equivalent
- b) Registration with the respective Certification Board for Music Therapists such as MT-BC (USA), HPC-UK Arts Therapist (UK), and RMT (Australia).



- c) Relevant knowledge & experience in working with children & youth with special needs & a wide range of disabilities.
